In spite of the global pandemic, the GPC team advanced our mission to protect and steward ecologically valuable lands and to connect people with nature. The current surge in development across our region makes it imperative that we protect streams, shorelines, forestlands, and farms from conversion now. Preserving these natural areas not only sustains our

local wildlife, it sustains us as well.

In 2020, GPC secured a record amount of funding from grants and community contributions. Those dollars went right to work creating, expanding, and stewarding some truly magnificent nature preserves.

In order to better manage this expanding suite of preserves, GPC is looking to our members and community groups for assistance. In 2020, we expanded our stewardship staff and secured a multi-year grant that funds four, full-time AmeriCorps VISTA members who dedicate a year of national service to improve our community. With this additional capacity, we are excited to offer opportunities for everyone to protect and connect

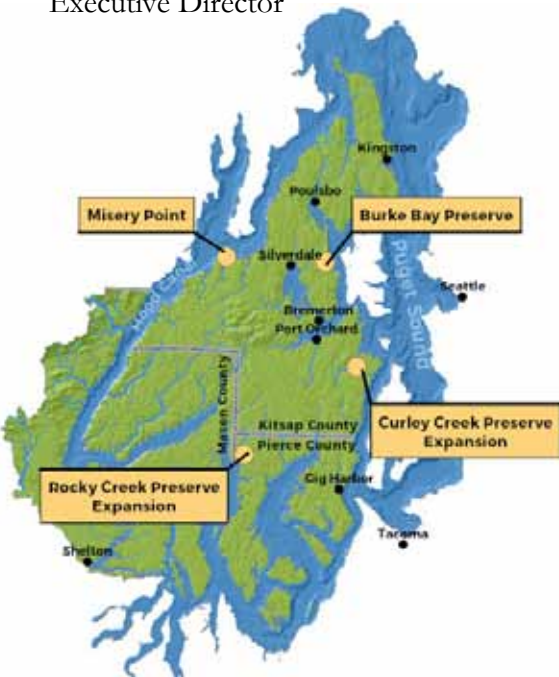
with the lands that help define us.

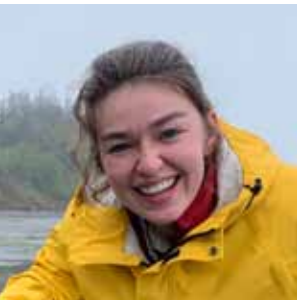

## Stewardship + Restoration

Thank you grantors, volunteers, and community partners!



### Lay Wildrose Restoration

We couldn't hold many volunteer events in 2020, but that didn't stop GPC's stewardship team from prioritizing restoration work. The Lay Wildrose Preserve in Gig Harbor benefited from several grants, including the Washington Native Plant Society, Gig Harbor Rotary, and One Tree Planted + Promise the Pod. The preserve was highlighted for Orca Recovery Day and was included in Conservation Associate Ali Erskine's virtual presentation to local students, who learned about the importance of native plants to shoreline health, especially in the face of climate change.



### Clear Creek Trail

At the beginning of the pandemic, county parks closed leaving one safe place to walk, run and bike with the kiddos—The Clear Creek Trail. With partners from Kitsap Regional Library, Discovery Play Days, and Kitsap Salmon Tours, events were available virtually and still are! Restoration projects were postponed but Mother Nature was not to be put off. Volunteers that could, came out for trash detail, mowing, brush trimming, and leaf blowing. Many thanks for your support of the Clear Creek Task Force and to all our volunteers.



### Volunteer of the Year

GPC volunteer Diane Fitzpatrick contributed over 300 hours helping GPC prepare for reaccreditation by The Land Trust Accreditation Commission. National accreditation is one of the highest marks of excellence and public trust that a land trust can receive and preparing for review is no small task. Diane's many hours in the GPC office helped GPC staff stay on top of our filing and document organization in preparation for our review. Thank you, Diane!

## Connecting during COVID

GPC leveraged cancellations into opportunities for growth

When it became clear that GPC's plans—our 20th anniversary celebration, Spring Dinner, Walk & Talks, and summer camp—would all have to be cancelled, it took a while for the team to adapt to the abrupt reality of 2020. Thanks to incredible community support, GPC was able to use the newfound time to rethink our engagement projects in the short term (going virtual) and create long-term plans to sustainably advance our mission.

On May 12th, 2020, we celebrated 20 years of conservation with our members on Zoom. Over the course of the year, Executive Director Nate Daniel gave over a dozen virtual presentations to continue GPC's

outreach to new community partners. In the fall, GPC held our annual fundraising event with a virtual auction and film fest, which raised over \$100,000 from sponsors, auction donors, and members.

One of the biggest adjustments GPC made during 2020, was the transformation of the NextGen Outdoor Camp into a program that reaches more students on a year-long basis. At the end of 2020, GPC was awarded an AmeriCorps VISTA grant to support four full-time, college-educated VISTA members over three years. In addition, GPC received invaluable program and COVID-relief support from The Russell Family Foundation.

GPC's Events & Outreach Associate Claire Voris was integral in securing the grants and facilitating community partnerships to transform the Curley Creek Tyner Preserve into GPC's premier Land Labs site. Special thanks to Pat & Steve Weagant—who spent several days helping clear trails—and to everyone who helped create the library of tools, including bird and bat houses, plant ID guides, a native plant nursery, and a game camera. Building these resources for students offered opportunities for GPC staff, volunteers, and partners to connect to nature during an isolating year.

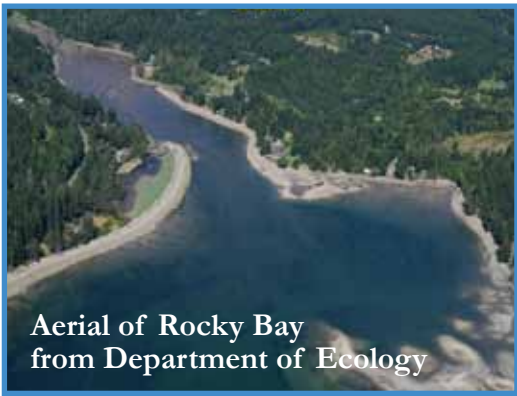

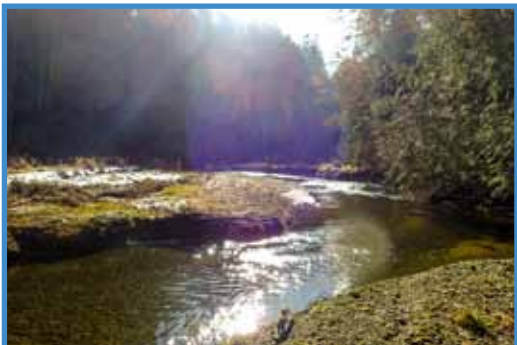


## Rocky Creek Preserve

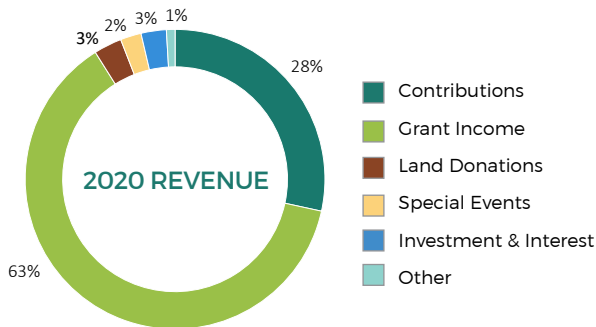

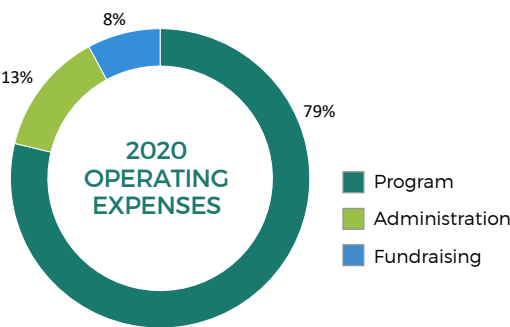
